**TOWNSHIP OF WINFIELD - RESOLUTION #22-15  
COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY  
AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE  
CITY OF RAHWAY FOR THE PROVISIONS OF PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES**

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Winfield is in need of a Health Officer to provide health services of a technical and professional nature; and

**WHEREAS**, the full-time Health Office for the City of Rahway has previously provided Health Services to the Township of Winfield pursuant to prior agreements; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Winfield and the City of Rahway have agreed to enter into a Shared Services Agreement pursuant to N.J.S.A 26:3A2-1 et seq. for the provisions of Public Health Services.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Mayor and Commissioners of the Township of Winfield, County of Union and State of New Jersey, that the Mayor and Municipal Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a Shared Services Agreement between the Township of Winfield and the City of Rahway, substantially in the form attached hereto, for Health Officer services.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that pursuant to the Local Health Services Act, N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-1 et seq., such Agreement shall be filed with and open to the public for inspection at the offices of the Municipal Clerk, and such Agreement shall take effect upon the adoption.

Jonathan Hassinger, 13B Atlantic- Questioned 2 police vehicles and asked if COVID relief funds were used/release. All commissioners responded no, Mayor Reilly responded to his inquires.; Mr. Hassanger questioned how damage occurred, Mayor Reilly responded.

Jenifer Clementi- Koomer, 90 Gulfstream- Commented about the flooding that took place that night.

Mike Hassinger, 23B Wavecrest- Questioned 2% budget cap; asked what biggest line item will be; Mayor Reilly responded still working on budget; Mr. Hassanger asked to contract on neighboring town or county for police; Mayor Reilly responded; Concern about parking violations; asked about Municipal Services Act – copy was handed to attorney.
