#### TOWNSHIP OF WINFIELD- ORD. # 451 AMENDED COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AN ORDIANCE FIXING SALARIES OF CERTAIN OFFICALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WINFIELD FOR 2021

Be it ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Winfield, County of Union: WHEREAS, the Township Committee desires to change the Section 1 of Ordinance # 451 NOW, THEREFORE, by the Township Committee of the Township of Winfield, County of Union, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 451 is hereby amended as follows;

- 1. Township Clerk \$60,000.00 per annum, payable biweekly
- 2. Registrar \$4,000.00, per annum, payable quarterly

**SECTION 1:** The salaries of all officials and employees of the Township of Winfield, hereinafter designated are hereby established and fixed in the amounts indicated;

- 4. Township Clerk \$60,967.00 per annum, payable biweekly
- 5. Registrar \$1,000.00, per annum, payable quarterly
- Clerical Services Class "A" \$15.00 per hour / Class "B" \$12.50 per hour / Class "C" \$10.00, payable biweekly
- 7. Chief Financial Officer \$15,000.00 per annum, payable biweekly
- 8. Administrative/Bookkeeper \$45,336.00 per annum, payable biweekly
- 9. Tax Assessor \$6,000.00 per annum, payable biweekly
- 10. Tax Collector \$3,500.00 per annum, payable biweekly
- 11. Municipal Judge \$10,675.00 per annum, payable biweekly
- 12. Court Administrator \$15,750.00 per annum, payable biweekly
- 13. Deputy Court Administrator \$23.35 per hr., payable biweekly
- 14. Municipal Prosecutor \$3,250.00 per annum, payable quarterly
- 15. Emergency Management Coordinator \$155.00 per annum, payable annually
- 16. Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator \$55.00 per annum, payable annually
- 17. Fire Sub-Code Official \$655.00 per annum, payable annually
- 18. Building Sub-Code Official \$5,000.00 per annum, payable quarterly
- 19. Electrical Sub-Code Official \$1,500.00 per annum, payable quarterly
- 20. Plumbing Sub-Code Official \$40.00 per hour (estimated max \$900 per annum)
- 21. Police Personnel Reference to Chief and PBA contract

# CITIZEN'S FORUM:

Barbara Spiegel, 8C Seafoam- Asked for an explanation on purchase orders from last month's meeting; Inquired on fee for the Cranford Public Library usage; Asked for an explanation on purchase order toward senior citizen services. Mayor Genz responded to Ms. Spiegel's inquires. Armond Hasinger, 8D Seafoam- Inquired about the 2% cap in regard to tax increase. Mayor Genz responded accordingly. Commissioner Rielly stated the State Aid does not increase, and none of the commissioners are drawing a salary being on the board. Winfield has lowest taxes in the County of Union.

Debbie Weiss, 52 Seafoam- Asked about signage as it relates to commercial vehicles. Mayor Genz informed her, this is in process and they are looking into it.

John Diorio, 12B Wavecrest- Stated we cannot wait as long as previously done to repaint the yellow lines, fire hydrants; We need to work together when we do our budgets. Mayor Genz responded the property is Mutual Hosing, we volunteered, we all got together and helped. We will get together on it and get it done.

Erin Kelly, 20B Pacific- Stated she tried to purchase flood insurance but is unable to since Winfield is not considered a flood area, does the committee have any plans to change that. Mayor Genz informed her at the moment we don't. If we are designated a flood zone then it would require everyone to obtain flood insurance. Ms. Kelly stated in light of people being rescued by boat out of their homes in town last week, to check with the fire department. People needed to be rescued. Mayor Genz stated we do not have a boat, this was an unprecedented storm. We had to evacuate 1 family. Ms. Kelly inquired about the Municipal Policy increased, submitted an OPRA request on same; submitted before the flood. Mayor Genz responded we would get that to her.

Nanette Babinetz, 11 Atlantic- Inquired if we have an emergency response system? Mayor Genz we have a reverse 911.

Barbara Spiegiel, 8C Seafoam- Thanked the chief, glad to see police vehicles moving around more frequently and in different spots- we were heard. Also complimented yellow lines and fire hydrants; and commented on the flooding from the previous storm.

Sissy Dulowski, 15 Riverview- Asked if we are changing the leaf pickup, would we change the signs. Mayor Genz, we are trying this out and working with PD. We will revisit next year if ordinance needs to be changed.

Commissioner Reilly- Commented on the storm and the quick response to reaching out to police to block off the street that was flooding. Thanked the police.

WPD Chief Mazzarella: Gave an update on Emergency Management

Rose Mary Lobdel, 8A Atlantic- Thank you – for having truck removed; in the future will anything be done to have cars removed? Mayor Genz replied, we try to give leeway. If it's a legal, registered vehicle we cannot remove. Chief Mazarella stated they do give tickets to vehicles parked where they shouldn't be; if car is insured and registered, allowed on a public road.

**ADJOURNMENT:** There being nothing further to come before the Township Committee, Mayor Genz moved to adjourn, Commissioner Koomer seconded the motion.
