CITIZEN'S FORUM: Jen Crosser, 96B Wavecrest- Asked about why the Township did not apply for the grant for the playground- Mayor Reilly responded that we haven't at this time. We can reapply once County has grant available- 2 years ago there was a problem having items removed & replaced, Township had to supply maintenance. We will look into it next year.

Inquired about current deer hunt. County stated that they would be letting neighbors know. – Mayor Reilly asked Chief Mazzarella, who responded that the County hasn't notified the Township. Fire Chief Dustin has answered he can provide.

Chief Dustin- asked about their wish list, how does next year look for them, personal protection equipment, etc.- nothing has been done. Mayor Reilly said we are still waiting for the funds from the State. Clerk Slowik- many phone calls as recent as last week were made to the DCA on an update; they have nothing available yet; Fire Department roof was replaced with Infrastructure Grant money; had to call NJ Doors to come back out for estimate to repair, not replace bay doors which would be approximately a \$23,000.00 difference from original price received; Commissioner Byrne stated no other monies have been released by the state; Commissioner Koomer state bay doors are not covered in grant.
