

AMENDED ORDINANCE REQUIRING DOG LICENSES

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the licensing of dogs and authorizing the impounding of stray animals found running around at large in the Township limits. The ordinance, as above entitled, passed by the Township Committee on June 25, 1942, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Be it ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Winfield, in the County of Union:

1. That the Township Committee is hereby authorized to issue licenses and to charge fees of \$1.00 annually, in addition to the regular twenty-five cents State rabies control tax for all dogs owned or harbored by the inhabitants of this Township.

2. All dogs, cats, or other domesticated animals found running at large within the Township limits, may be taken to a pound in any nearby community designated by the Township Committee, and the pound keeper in charge of such pound is to receive and confine any such animal until they shall be lawfully redeemed or sold.

3. All impounded animals not redeemed by the owner within seven (7) days after they are impounded shall be sold by the pound keeper in the manner contained in the statutes related therein.

4. Any person or persons violating the license provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not exceeding the maximum fine herein fixed.

5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
