## TOWNSHIP OF WINFIELD AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING HEALTH IN THE TOWNSHIP OF WINFIELD

Be it ordained by the Board of Health of the Township of Winfield, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey:

SECTION 1. Health examinations. Every person shall before performing any work or or service in any Barber Shop, Hair-dressing or Beauty Parlor submit to a physical examination by a duly licensed physician of the State of New Jersey and designated by the Board of Health so to do.

SECTION la. No person shall engage in or be employed in a business in the Township of Winfield where it is or may become his duty to or he does handle food, drink or other articles intended for human consumption, unless such person is free from all communicable disease and he is in possession of a certificate issued by the Board of Health which certificate shall be issued only after such person has been examined by a duly licensed physician of the State of New Jersey, designated by the Board of Health, certifying to such freedom from disease.

SECTION 1b. Every such examination shall expire and become void on the 31st day of December of the year in which it is issued. A person holding such certificate expiring as aforesaid, shall not be required to secure a new certificate before the tenth day of January following such expiration date unless the Board issues a written request for special examination.

SECTION 2. Sale of Food. No person shall sell or offer or expose for sale any meat or meat products in the Township of Winfield unless such meat or meat products bear a mark or stamp or other evidence of approval given after inspection by the United States Government or a Governmental Agency requiring equal standards of fitness and cleanliness.

SECTION 2a. No meat, fish or poultry shall be sold or offered or exposed for sale in the Township of Winfield except inside a building or store or part of a building which is properly constructed to prevent contamination of such meat, fish or poultry by flies, insects, dust or dirt.

SECTION 3. Manufacture or Preparation of Foods. No person shall engage in the manufacture or preparation of food or drink intended for sale for human consumption without first securing a license so to do.

SECTION 3z. Such license shall be issued by the Board of Health upon application made to it accompanied by a fee of two dollars and shall expire on the 31st day of December of the year in which it is issued.

SECTION 3b. No such license shall be issued until all health requirements of the State of New Jersey and of the Township of Winfield have been complied with.

Temperature of buildings. The owner of any building occupied as a residence by more than two families shall provide heat from the first day of October in each year to the first day of May of the succeeding year so that the temperature of each apartment or living unit shall be kept at a temperature of sixty-eight degrees Fahrenheit or above, between the hours of 6 A.M. in the morning and 10 P.M. in the evening. This provision shall apply, however, only in cases where the owner is obligated to furnish heat by the terms of the lease or letting. Pasteurization of Milk. No person, firm or corporation shall sell or SECTION 5. offer for sale, or deliver, or have in possession with intent to sell or deliver, in the Township of Winfield, milk, cream, or other fluid milk products unless said milk, cream or other fluid milk products have been pasteurized by the process of heating every particle of milk or milkproducts to a temperature of not less than 142 degrees Fahrenheit and holding same at that temperature for thirty consecutive minutes in approved pasteurizing apparatus or equipment, or by such other method demonstrated to accomplish the same results; provided however, nothing in this section shall apply to milk, cream, or other fluid milk products certified to by a duly organized medical milk commission, said duly organized medical milk commission being defined for the purpose of this ordinance in Chapter 237 of the Law of 1909 and

SECTION 6. Venereal Disease. Every physician must report to this Health Officer in writing within twelve hours after his professional attendance the name of every patient he or she shall have under his or her professional care or treatment, who shall be affected with Syphilis, Gonorrhea or Chancroid, or their complications together with the precise locality where such patients may be found.

the amendments and supplements thereto.

SECTION 6a. In cases of syphilis, gonorrhea or chancroid or their complications the Board of Health shall not disclose the names or addresses of any person reported as suffering from the same. The report of these diseases shall be sent in sealed envelopes.

SECTION 7. Peddlers of Ice Cream shall handle their product in a sanitary manner.

All excess paper, waste, cups and spoons shall be deposited in a proper container and in this way maintain the cleaniness of our streets, sidewalks and public grounds.

SECTION 8. Milk delivery men shall practice modern sanitary methods in the handling of their dairy products. They shall not store any case or cases of empty milk bottles on any sidewalk, street or public ground in this Community.

SECTION 9. Penalties. Any violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a

fine not exceeding one hundred dollars and not less than two dollars.

## REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with this ordinance are hereby repealed. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

## NOTICE

The foregoing ordinance was introduced and passed on first reading at the meeting of the Board of Health of the Township of Winfield, New Jersey, held on Monday, June 25th, 1945 and will be considered for final passage, after public hearing at a Board of Health Meeting at the Township Offices, 12 Gulfstream Avenue, Winfield, New Jersey, on Monday, July 23rd.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on final reading at a meeting of the Board of Health of the Township of Winfield held on Monday, October 15th, 1945.
