SUPPLEMENT AND AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO.21 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING HEALTH IN THE TOWNSHIP OF WINFIELD.

Be it ordained by the Board of Health of the Township of Winfield, County of Union, and State of New Jersey.

Amendment to Section 2 and 2A:

Section 10: It shall be unlawful to offer for sale fish, poultry, or meat from a truck in this Township during the months of June, July, August, September and October, unless said products are sold from a vehicle known as a frozen food truck, and said foods are in a frozen state at the time of sale.

Supplement to Section 5:

DATED: April 28, 1947

Section 11: It shall be the duty of the Commissioner of Health or some person designated by him to periodically remove, and at his discretion, various grades of milk from delivery trucks for the purpose of analysis. Said analysis shall be primarily for the determination of bacteria and butter fat content. The vendor shall comply with the request for a sample thereof and shall in no way interfere with the analysis or inspection of same.
