## PEDDLER ORDINANCE

An ordinance to license and regulate cartmen, auctioneers, hawkers, peddlers, itinerant vendors of merchandise,
employment agencies, pawn brokers, bill posters, bill tackers,
scavengers, vendors of medicines and remedies, and the place or
places or premises in which or at which the different kinds of
business or occupations are carried on or conducted, and to fix
the fees to be paid for such licenses, and to prohibit all persons and places unlicensed from acting, using or being used in
said capacities and for such uses and purposes.

Be it ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Winfield, in the County of Union:

- 1. No person or persons shall carry on or conduct the business of cartmen, auctioneers, hawkers, peddlers, itinerant vendors of merchandise, employment agencies, pawn brokers, bill posters, bill tackers, scavengers, vendors of medicines and remedies, within the Township of Winfield aforesaid, without having first obtained a license from the Township Clerk so to do.
- 2. The Township Clerk is hereby authorized to issue any usch license upon the payment by the applicant of the proper fee therefore as hereinafter provided, together with the sum of fifty cents for the cost and expense of issuing such license.
- 3. Every such license shall remain in force and be valid only for the time therein expressed, and shall apply only to the person or persons to whom granted and shall not be transferable.
- 4. Any person to whom such license is granted is hereby required to exhibit such license whenever called upon so to do.
- 5. The license fees under this ordinance shall be as follows: Cartmen, \$5.00; Auctioneers, \$25.00; hawkers, peddlers, itinerant vendors of merchandise, \$5.00; employment agencies, \$25.00; pawn brokers, \$50.00, beauty parlors, \$25.00; bill posters

and bill tackers, \$5.00; scavengers, \$5.00; vendors of medicines and remedies, \$5.00.

6. Each and every person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a fine of not more than two hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail for not more than ninety days; and the magistrate before whom any such person may be convicted may impose such punishment by fine or imprisonment in the county jail as he may see fit, not exceeding the maximum herein fixed.
