

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED  
 "AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE POSITION OF  
 SECRETARY TO THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE  
 TOWNSHIP OF WINFIELD, FIXING THE SALARY  
 THEREOF AND DEFINING THE QUALIFICATIONS AND  
 DUTIES THEREOF".

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of  
 Winfield:

SECTION:1: Section 2 of the Ordinance of which this Ordinance  
 is amendatory is hereby amended to read as follows:

"The salary of the person holding said position as Secretary or Deputy Clerk of the Township of Winfield, whichever designation may be established by any Resolution of the Township Committee, shall be the sum of Thirty-four Hundred(\$3,400.00) Dollars per annum, payable in semi-monthly installments by the Treasurer of the Township of Winfield. Said sum shall be the total compensation to be paid for the services to be rendered in either of the above mentioned capacities and all fees or other monies received by said Secretary or Deputy Clerk while holding said office shall be the property of the Township of Winfield and shall monthly be turned over to the Treasurer of the Township of Winfield for deposit in the funds of the Township".

SECTION 2: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or are amended accordingly.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication according to law.
