
AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING NOTICE TO POLICE HEADQUARTERS
OF ANY PUBLIC MEETING IN ORDER THAT POLICE AND FIRE PROTECTION
MAY BE PROVIDED FOR SAME.

The Township Committee of the Township of Winfield,
Union County, New Jersey do ordain:

1. In order that proper police and fire protection
may be provided at all public meetings within the limits of
this Township, it shall hereafter be unlawful for any persons to
hold a public meeting in this Township without having first
given the Police Department of the Township five (5) days
written notice of the time and place and date of the holding of
said meeting.
2. Any person violating or causing to be violated
Section No.1 of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof
be liable or subject to a fine not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00)
Dollars or imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days in the
county jail, or both.
3. Any complaint regarding the violation of this
ordinance shall be cognizable before the Recorder's Court of
the Township of Winfield.
4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
